## Background

#### **MAIN CHALLENGES:**

- Investment pressure around the Vistula embankment
- Fear of interrupting the ecological corridor between Natura 2000 areas and valuable buffer habitats
- Excessive pressure on the Natura 2000 area caused by car traffic
- Lack of legal regulations regarding the location of bicycle paths on embankments

#### **CITY PROFILE:**

- **Population:** 32 781 / 96,3 km2
- Location: Małopolska region, Wielicki district Kraków Metropolitan Area (25 km to Kraków city centre)
- Niepołomice Town and 12 villages
- The largest industrial zone in Małopolska
- The largest forest complex (The Natura 2000 protected area)



## Approach



### What is being done?

- Vistula Bicycle Path is part of a nationwide project that connects eight voivodeships. It runs through the most valuable places of the Vistula Valley and its tributaries (through the entire Niepołomice commune)
- The newly developed bicycle path along the Vistula Valley connects the urban and industrial zones of Niepołomice municipality with the rural areas and the protected Natura 2000 area
- Revitalization of the Vistula embankment while maintaining ecological functions and biodiversity

### What was your starting point?

 Provisions in the local development plans towards preserving green areas along watercourses in order to maintain migration corridors and use for bicycle infrastructure

## Methodology



- Regular meetings and consultations among stakeholders (multisectoral collaboration):
  - administration of provincial roads
  - Polish Water Survey
  - National Forests
  - Niepołomice municipality
- Financing of a bicycle path along the embankments (on a distance of 19.5 km) by the administration of the provincial roads – € 1.2 million
- Investments in plots by the Polish Water Survey
- Parking lot provided by the municipality (permeable surface)
- Acquisition of the missing plots by the municipality

## Outcome



### What was achieved?

- Reduced car traffic on weekends in the city center and near Natura 2000 areas
- Increased bicycle traffic thanks to the possibility of leaving the car in the newly created parking lot near the Vistula embankment
- Removal of invasive species and abandoned waste

## **Next steps**

• The next section of the bicycle path will connect the Niepołomice municipality with Krakow city, which will have a positive impact on air quality and encourage citizens to spend their free time actively, connecting with nature.

## Lessons learned

### **Key elements:**

- an amendment to the act allowing for the construction of the path on the embankment
- close cooperation with the funding body and owner of the embankment
- providing the necessary infrastructure for drivers (parking lots)
- acquisition of required land from the residents of the municipality (consultations and dialog with citizens)

### What can be improved?

 more focus on cooperation with the National Forests managing the Natura 2000 area
